Scratchboard to Sgraffito

Scratchboard uses tools to remove the black coating to reveal the color underneath.

The same process can be applied to clay, using the same tools; called sgraffito





Build your form

This technique can be applied to may forms:

- Cup and saucer
- Slump/hump mold
- Box
- Plate
- Tumblers
- Other









Apply Engobe

Just enough to cover the clay

- Engobe is a colored slip
- Comes in a variety of colors
- Applied to leatherhard clay
- Allow engobe to dry to satin sheen

You can also use underglaze for this decoration technique









Design Inspiration

Many ceramic artist who create amazing sgraffito design as well as scratchboard artist.

- Start with a gray scale
 - Ensures variety of line and value
- Zentangle or line designs
- Any theme

Draw design to scale







Sgraffito

- Transfer your design
- Carve through the layer of engobe to reveal the color of clay

Finishing

- Fire your piece
- May use watered down underglaze as a wash
- Seal with clear glaze and fire again





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Opposites Attract

Sgraffito - scratching through colored slip
Mishima - is filling a carved design with colored slip



- Set of tumblers
- Plate
- Hump mold









Plate Design Inspired by drawing and painting project

- Symmetrical watercolor design
 - Using winged animals for inspiration
- Radial balance
 - Tempera paint mandala design
- Clay
 - Sketch 1 symmetrical, 1 radial design
 - Throw plate







Plate Design Mishima

- Steps to Mishima
 - Sketch a line design
 - Transfer your design using a pencil
 - Carve design, wider with small loop tool
 - Paint 2-3 coats of of engobe into carved design
 - Let set up to leatherhard
 - Scrape excess away with metal rib





Newsprint Transfers

Monoprint

- Creating newsprint transfers
 - May start with underglaze outline
- Create patterns with colored slip

Remember to paint on the colors foreground layer first, then the background

- When design is leatherhard (satin sheen),
 brush on background slip

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- When background slip is dried to a DO NOT DUPLICATE
 leatherhard ready to apply to clay form
- Apply using hands and a soft rib to ensure good contact







Newsprint Transfers Continued

- When the newsprint has lost a lot of moisture, slowly peel it away from the surface
- Add any marks to the surface or carve away some areas of slip

Name and school on the bottom

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Other Image transfers

- Printed image transfer using Regular
 Film Adhering Liquid
- Waterslide Decal Paper
- Fired on Images Laser Printer Paper

- Things to look for
 - Emotion
 - Proportion
 - 3D features

Portraits/Faces Nose/Eyes

- Nose
 - break it down to simple shapes
 - right triangle with 2 balls of clay

YouTube: Clay Nose Construction

- Eyes
 - Pressed in eye sockets
 - Ball of clay cut in half
 - Thin coil for upper and lower eyelid

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Drill in pupil

YouTube: Sculpting Eyes



Mouth

- Mouth
 - Upper lip, 2 tear drops of clay and ball
 - Smooth and to face, smooth upper seam into the face
 - Lower lip: tapered coil, smooth lower seam into the face
 - Teeth clay, broke dishes DO NOT DUPLICATE

Ears

- Ear
 - Outline ear with a coil, using a ball for the lower earlobe
 - Teardrop of clay for tragus
 - Small coils for the inner bumps in the ear







Options

- 2D Portrait using colored clay
 - start by uses stain to create tints of a single color
 - Posterize a portrait
 - Outline on tracing paper
 - Fill with colored clay
 - Smooth back side



Simplified/symbolic portraits

- Figure that represent artist
- Feature added after glaze firing
- Detailed glazing
- Inspired by Kirsten




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
