CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION FROM THE TIME IT WAS MADE

When was it made? What was going on at the time (social issues, events, etc.)? Who made it?

Who was the audience?

What was the significance of subject matter? Materials? Techniques?

What did various symbols mean at the time?

Question: What do we know about it in its current context?

CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION REGARDING ITS CURRENT PRESENTATION

Who is presenting it? How is it presented?

Who is the contemporary audience?

What is going on at this time (social issues, events, etc.)?

What is the contemporary significance of subject matter? Materials?

Techniques?

What do various symbols mean in contemporary times?

Question: What is this ABOUT? What themes/ideas does it suggest? What function does it serve?

MAKING CONNECTIONS AMONG OBSERVATIONS AND INFORMATION

This is about technology, change, or progress.

This is about showing things as they really look in the world.

This is about the need for order and organization.

This is about dreams, fantasies or other flights of human imagination.

This is about standards and ideals of beauty.

This is about unique qualities of color, line, shape or texture.

This is about loving and caring relationships.

This is about daily life, work or play.

This is about good, happy or joyful times.

This is about the way different people live.

This is about sad, sober, or unpleasant situations.

This is about nature and the environment.

This is about conflict, aggression, or disagreement.

This makes no obvious statement about human issues or concerns.

This comments upon social issues.

This is about how people sometimes seem alone.

This gives clues to different roles that people play in life.

This is about the way the world ought to look or the way people ought to live.

This functions to provide for a basic human need.

This functions to tell a story or record an event.

This functions to communicate strong feelings or emotions.

This functions for use in religious or spiritual ceremony, ritual, or meditation.
