How to Participate:

1. Artwork must fit in a 4 x 6" or 4.125 x 9.5" envelope that can be mailed.
2. Use any media that can be mailed.
3. Decorate both the envelope and its enclosure.
4. One entry per art teacher (not students).
5. Include your name, school, title, medium, size, and year of work on the back of your artwork, along with a short statement about your submission (optional).
